# The Beyond Borders Humanitarian Mission for Aceh **Program in an Effort to Establish International Relations** with Educational Institutions in Aceh

Abstract: The Beyond Borders Humanitarian Mission for Aceh (BBHMA) Community Service Program is an international community service program implemented by Sultan Idris University of Education, Malaysia and UIN Ar-raniry Banda Aceh, Indonesia. BBHMA was implemented on December 12-15, 2024 with 14 UPSI students, 15 UIN Ar-Raniry students, 4 UPSI lecturers and staff and 2 UIN Ar-Raniry Banda Aceh lecturers. This program aims to expand the humanitarian network in activities carried out by students of both countries and open an international network for the development of education both in Indonesia and Malaysia. The development of an international network is one indicator that an institution has the desire to become an institution with an excellent predicate for both secondary, high school and higher education institutions. The BBHMA program is implemented in several forms of activities, namely cultural discussions between students, psychoeducation to students in elementary and high schools, providing assistance to several schools and Islamic boarding schools and signing a cooperation agreement between the UPSI institution and schools. This program has been successfully implemented with several achievements, namely the establishment of communication between UPSI and UIN Ar-raniry students, the establishment of cooperation between institutions and the distribution of several aids to Islamic boarding schools that experienced disasters some time ago in Aceh Besar. This Community Service recommends to all educational institutions both in Indonesia and Malaysia to carry out study tours or similar activities not only for charitable tourism but also can be filled with humanitarian activities and community service. in the context of organizational development.

# INTRODUCTION

According to Law Number 20, paragraph 2 concerning the National Education System, universities are obliged to implement the Tri Dharma of Higher Education: education, research, and community service. The Community Service Program is one of the Tri Dharma of Higher Education that is mandatory for universities in Indonesia. According to the Minister of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, 2020, a community service program is an academic community activity that utilizes science and technology to advance public welfare and improve the nation's intellectual life.

The Beyond Borders Humanitarian Mission for Aceh (BBHMA) program is a community service program initiated by Aminurrashid College, Sultan Idris University of Education (UPSI) Malaysia and implemented jointly by two institutions: UPSI Malaysia and UIN Ar-Raniry Banda Aceh, Indonesia. The BBHMA program aims to develop interinstitutional collaboration, build awareness of the humanitarian spirit among students, and strengthen ties between Indonesia and Malaysia. The international community service program also aligns with Article 22, paragraph 2, of the Regulation of the Minister of Research and Technology (Mendikbud, 2023), which states that educational unit partnerships take the form of collaboration with the business world, industry, parents/guardians, learning communities, partners, and/or other organizations. This community service activity is a partnership with universities in Indonesia and Malaysia that aims to have a positive impact on both parties.

# **METHODS**

This community service activity was carried out for 5 days, namely on December 12-16, 2024. The activities were carried out in several places including: UIN Ar-raniry Banda Aceh Campus, SD Negeri 29 Banda Aceh City, PAUD Az Zahra Lamteumen Timur, SMPIT Al Farabi and several historical places in Banda Aceh City and Aceh Besar. The activities were carried out in several forms, namely Intercultural dialogue before and after the presence of UPSI students in Banda Aceh, Psychoeducation on Early Childhood Education, learning science more fun, cultural dialogue and the signing of cooperation between UPSI Institutions, SMPIT Al Farabi and SD Negeri 29 Banda Aceh City.

BBHMA's community service activities have been successfully implemented at several locations in Banda Aceh City and Aceh Besar Regency. These activities involved the community and stakeholders in schools, universities, and children's education centers.
